Hon. Ababu-Terrah Namwamba, EGH Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Kenya

Hon. Ababu Tarrah Namwamba, EGH, is a distinguished Kenyan politician, international lawyer, and advocate for youth development and human rights. He has served in various high-profile roles, including Cabinet Secretary for Youth Affairs, Sports, and the Arts, and as Chief Administrative Secretary (CAS) in

Kenya's Ministry of Foreign Affairs since 2018. Namwamba is the leader of the Labour Party of Kenya, a position he has held since 2016. A seasoned parliamentarian, Namwamba represented his constituency in Kenya's 10th and 11th Parliaments, where he chaired key committees such as the Parliamentary Select Committee on Constitutional Review, the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee, and the Public Accounts Committee (PAC). He is known for sponsoring a record number of Private Member's Motions and Bills during his parliamentary tenure. As Minister for Sports and Youth Affairs, Namwamba played a pivotal role in passing the Sports Act, establishing the National Youth Council, and reforming the National Youth Service (NYS) and Youth Enterprise Fund. An accomplished scholar, Namwamba holds an LLM from American University, a Diploma in Legal Practice from the Kenya School of Law, and an LLB from the University of Nairobi. Recognized for his contributions, Namwamba received Kenya's highest civilian honor, the Elder of the Golden Heart (EGH), in 2012.



Admiral Karambir Singh (Retd) National Maritime Foundation

Admiral Karambir Singh, PVSM, AVSM, IN (Retd), was India's 24th Chief of the Naval Staff and is the Chairmanship of the National Maritime Foundation, New Delhi. He is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla, the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington, and the College of Naval Warfare,

Mumbai. He has served in the Directorate of Naval Air Staff at the Integrated Headquarters of the Ministry of Defence (Navy) and has been Captain (Air) and Officer-in-Charge of the Naval Air Station at Mumbai. Admiral Singh has served as the Chief of Staff of the Eastern Naval Command and as a Vice-Admiral, he was the Director-General, Project Seabird. Thereafter, he was appointed as the Deputy Chief of Naval Staff. He assumed Command of the Indian Navy on 31 May 2019, serving until his retirement from active service on 30 November 2021. The Admiral was honoured with the prestigious award of the "Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Star (2nd Highest order)" by the government of Japan for his dedication to strengthening the collaborative efforts between India and Japan in the realm of national defense, particularly in the context of achieving a free and open Indo-Pacific region.



Notably, he contributed to crafting the addresses delivered by Mr. Abe to the parliamentarians of India, Australia, and the United States. Among these, the speech delivered at the Indian Parliament in 2007, titled

"Confluence of the Two Seas," continues to resonate with the policy community in Delhi. Dr. Taniguchi's latest publication, Prime Minister Abe's Speeches (in Japanese), explores how Mr. Abe strategically employed speeches to advance national priorities, such as Abenomics, the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (QUAD), and the Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP) strategy. Since April 1, 2023, Dr. Taniguchi has served as a Specially Appointed Professor at the University of Tsukuba and as a Special Adviser at the Fujitsu Future Studies Centre. Prior to these roles, he was a professor at Keio University while also working at the Prime Minister's Office alongside Mr. Abe and his senior advisors. He holds an LL.B. from the University of Tokyo and a doctorate in national security from Takushoku University.




Dr. Aparna Central University of Jharkhand
